# Construction

The school features a steel frame, pre-cast concrete floors, brick and render cladding constructed on piled foundations. The school will house 1188 pupils and comprises a mix of single, two and three storey sections.

The project also encompasses the construction of new playing fields and sporting facilities. Parts of our works also include enabling works for the installation of temporary classrooms.

## **Award-Winning Environmental Features**

The project won the London Borough of Bromley 'Contribution to Sustainable Design and Construction' award. A key feature of the design is the inclusion of planted 'green roofs' which have positive effects on the environment.

Green roofs can retain a very high percentage of rainwater and provide slow and controlled water run off, thereby reducing the load on the drainage system and allowing much faster evaporation of accumulated moisture, they can also provide a safe habitat for insects and birds. Green roofs also improve the thermal performance of buildings, helping to keep them cool during warm weather by reducing heat absorption.





## **Phased Handover**

The project was handed over in a number of phases over a 91 week period with pupils occupying part of the school from week 66. Consequently, segregation of pupils from the construction works was a key feature in the management of the site.
