- Wage increases for builders, civil engineering operatives and Scottish plumbers under the Construction Industry Joint Council (CIJC) and Building and Allied Trades Joint Industry Council (BATJIC) agreements.
- Most wage awards this year held to 3.5-4.5%
- National statistics show average earnings in construction have risen since last November and increased over the past year by 3.1%

CIJC agreement, from 25 June 2007

Second part of a three-year agreement. The new rates are 4.3% higher:

Travel allowances will increase by the same rate and fare allowances will be linked to the retail prices index.

BATJIC agreement, from 11 June 2007

This agreement is for operatives in small and medium-sized firms that belong to the Federation of Master Builders. It gives an increase of 4%:

Semi-skilled rates (for plant operators) rise by 6% and additional skills payments and payments for discomfort, inconvenience or risk rise by about 6%. Daily fare allowances rise 4%. Apprentices under 19 and entrants over 19 receive increases of 2%.

Plumbers

Wages for plumbers in Scotland and Northern Ireland rose from 4 June. Hourly rates increased by 3.5%, following in the footsteps of their English counterparts who received a similar pay rise in January. The hourly rates remains 5-10% lower than in England.
